- We' y ago? (pronounced u ia gau). In proper English, we'd say: Where are you going?


Banana, sugarcane, papaya, coconut, bamboo plantations.

Jamaica exports sugar, coffee, bamboo, papaya, coconuts, sweet potatoes.

I'm visiting a banana plantation. Tourism brings high earnings, but in the off-season, when it rains a lot (April-November), they're much lower.

To produce as many bananas as possible, a plantation needs nine months (as much as a woman needs to give birth!).

The Columbus Park, on the shore, near the Discovery Bay (where Columbus landed when he discovered the Americas, but he called it Dry Harbor).








Dunn's River Falls is near the city of Ocho Rios, in Saint Ann Parish.

The city and the waterfall are popular tourist attractions.



The waterfall is almost 200 ft tall and 600 ft long, on natural terraces.

At the Green Grotto Caves, a 45-minute-long tour. We're entering with miner helmets on our heads.

Plenty of bats found their refuge here; they're flying around and above our heads.


In 1655, when the English invaded Spanish Jamaica, the Spanish governor, Don Cristobal, hid here.


A big part of the black population also hid in this cave, formed by water, which has a length of 10 miles and a surface of 28 square miles, while the depth is 13 meters.





During WW1, rhum was hidden here. It was made from sugar cane. Not long before that, the cave had been transformed into a nightclub. The government, however, forbid it, because the walls were decaying.





A million bats live here. They venture up to 7 miles out, looking for fruits.

Algae, snakes, A bat eats a thousand insects per night. lizards.






As guano (bat defecation) contains phosphorus, azote and sulphate, it was used for cannon explosives by pirates.

It's also used in medicine, and bat saliva is used as a cure to some illnesses.







In the town of Ocho Rios, there's a panoramic view towards the garden of the Thaw Park.









Bob Marley was religious. His way of life is called RASTA, or RASTAFARI, to which he converted together with his band in 1966, when the Emperor of Ethiopia, Haile Selassie, visited Jamaica.

Over 100,000 believers were present at the Kingston airport, the capital of the island, and the day of the visit, the 21st of April, was proclaimed a holiday, named *Grounation Day*.




Ras was the noble title equivalent to *Prince*, used by until coronation by the Emperor of Ethiopia. He was named Tafari Makonnen. Thus, the name of the religious movement means *Prince Tafari*, in the Amharic language (of semitic origins, the state language of Ethiopia).






On November 4th, 1980, Robert Nasta Marley, who, since childhood, chose Bob as his nickname (nickname coming from Robert), with final stage cancer, got baptized in the Ethiopian Orthodox Church in Kingston, with the name Berhane Selassie (*The Light of the Holy Trinity*).

I'm going through Spanish City.

I am tasting exotic fruits: jackfruit (yellow, sweet); Jamaican apple – red, sour (with a big, brown and hairy seed inside).





I'm trying out many tropical fruits: - *sour sop* = big, green fruit, with a white inside.; - *june plume* = it peeled off, then I ate the pulp - kind of sour; and exotic cakes: - *bammy* = made from cassava flour (yuca or manioc); - *girrada* = made from coconut flour; - *shamy* = sweet, black, made from coconut.



In Kingston, I slept at a hotel, Indies; \$75 a room. In the evening, I watched a Bruce Lee movie on the television, and I walked to the John R. Wong Supermarket. A very loud, fast kind of music wakes me up from my sleepiness.

His favorite colors: - green, for plantations; - yellow, for the sun; - red, for blood.





His most sold album, *The Legend*: 1.200.000 copies. In total, he released fourteen albums. He imposed a *black style* in music, loved in the entire world. *Exodus* was named *The Album of the century*.



I visited his bedroom, his kitchen (he had a gas stove and a special cook – Bob was vegetarian), a small store (that he owned) with colored glass windows and his bicycle inside. He smoked weed and meditated.
